## THE STORY OF HASHING

Hashman had existed long before the jogging movement took hold though their recent spurt in popularity must derive from at least part of the rejuvenated interest in running.

Hash historians, who reject any need for documentary proof, say the movement began nearly 40 years ago in Kuala Lumpur (now Malaysia).

An Australian named A.S. Gispert conceived the idea of working off weekend pounds by running every Monday night around the Padang (the city's huge open park). Gispert's system may actually have done little good, for he insisted on ending the Monday run by gulping down several cold beers at a local Chinese restaurant called The Hash House.

Several other patrons of this popular eatery thought this was a splendid way to spend a Monday evening and joined Gispert. Their imaginations took them into the countryside. The Hash House management saw profit in this venture and loaded up a beer wagon to meet the thirsty runners at the end of their jaunt.

In 1962, this movement burst out of the confines of Kuala Lumpur as Alumni were transferred to other posts. Today there are nearly 100 groups around the world in places like Malaysia (19), Sabah (8), Singapore (1), Brunei (2), Bahrain (1), Cyprus (2), Hong Kong (2), Indonesia (11), Iran (2), Japan (2), Korea (1), Oman (1), Philippines (1), Pakistan (1), The Gulf (1), Thailand (1), India (2), Australia (19), New Zealand (3), New Guinea (9), Fiji (2), New Hebrides (1), Kenya (1), Seychelles (1), Switzerland (1), Germany (1), U.K. (6), U.S.A. (8), Yugoslavia (1) .... convinced yet.

In keeping with the original intentions of the Hash there should be no rules as such, however the following are necessary as a guide or code which accommodates an accent on social, healthy exercise - whilst discouraging any source of "athleticism" of "competitiveness".

An ideal trail keeps everybody together for most of the run and the whole pack should be back within 10 minutes of one another, with your slowest runners being back in not much longer than 50 minutes - 1 hour from starting time.

Now to the actual laying of the trail, the following points should be adhered to whenever possible;

- (i) the start and direction of the trail should be clearly marked and uncomplicated for at least the first half mile at which point should be your first check. This check must be a good one, designed to hold the pack for as long as possible in order that the late comers can catch up. At the check it is optional as to whether you write the word check in bold letters, inscribe a large circle, or

a combination of both when using chalk, or when using flour enscribe a circle or place a blob of flour at least five times the size of your normal indication along the trail.

- (ii) Remember your checks are designed to hold up the pack until every member of the run is together before starting off on the next leg. In order to achieve this you should lay at least two false trails from each check point, but it is important to remember that a false trail should not be INDICATED OR MARKED over 150 yds in open country, 50 yds in semi-scrub, or 25 yds in thick scrub. You may place as many marks as you like within these distances but any mark over that distance indicates that particular trail is quite definitely on, REMEMBER THAT IT IS NOT THE NUMBER OF ARROWS BUT THE DISTANCE WHICH IS DECISIVE. A good run should have at least four good checks and if the checks are laid within the above code then there should be no need to write 'ON ON' however it is a good idea if only to jog the minds of the hounds that they should be calling this once having found the correct trail.
- (iii) When marking the trail each mark, if using chalk, an arrow, if using flour a blob of the same, should not be more than 25 yds from each other. This should be adhered to as closely as possible in order that the hares can be fairly certain when they have run out of trail. It is quite legitimate to make a sudden left or right turn from a comparatively straight trail without indicating such and the hares should realise they have over run the trail when the last mark was some 25 yds or more back. The only time it should be necessary to write CHECK BACK, or indicate same by a cross X if it you are worried that continuing in that direction may take them onto another leg of your trail, thus cutting out some of the run.
- (iv) If the last check has turned the pack onto a narrow long path, over which it is difficult to pass then your next check at the end of this path should be an especially good one designed to hold up the front men until those who, probably were doing the greatest amount of checking, and thus missed the last check, have time to catch up again. Remember at least four good checks which bring the whole pack together at least four times during a run.



- (v) Each trail should include a little of everything - a little shiggy, open country, a little bush, and level paths. Main roads should be avoided wherever possible and in particular no check should be laid on or even close to a road. Quite apart from the obvious dangers of having a pack milling about the middle of a road there is the problem of hearing the pack calling over traffic noise. The last check on the run again should be a particularly good one bringing the pack together for a good flat or downhill run in over a distance of at least half a mile, giving everybody a chance to stretch their legs and a chance for a little competitive running to those who insist on being so inclined.


You may if you wish on the last sector of the run indicate 'ON HOME' which means that each hound is now free to make his own way over whichever route he feels is quickest to the beer, but for the benefit of those who are not familiar with that particular area you must maintain a correct trail to the beer. After the run the hare is responsible for checking that all hounds have returned, if any are still missing by 2100 hrs he must organise search parties. He will also be responsible for ensuring that the area has been cleaned up prior to leaving for the 'ON ON' where he will take charge of the group singing.

#### Important

Repeat every call you hear. If necessary return along the trail until the next hound has been contacted. You will call 'ON ON' at each mark once you have established you are in fact on. On hearing "Where are You" give the appropriate reply i.e. "Checking" "on on" "check back" or "on home". This applies to all runners front, middle and rear.

We will then run from a different locality every two weeks during the summer months. However to run a Hash effectively there is a need for offices to be filled i.e. Grandmaster (looks after procedures), Hash Cash (looks after money), Hon Sec and Scribe (writes about the run and tells everybody where the next run is). I will take over all positions until we are able to select a committee. Please let me (Brian Rowe) at the Australian Embassy, 522331, know by Friday 10th June so that the curry can be catered for (hopefully the cost will be low).

## BEIJING HASH HOUSE HARRIERS

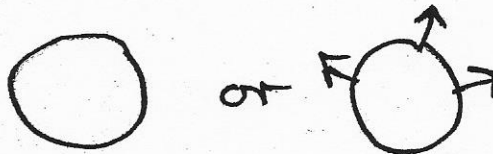
### BASIC RULES

#### TRAIL

Blobs of flour or chalk arrows approx every 15 to 20 M.

#### CHECK

Written as check or circle thus:



#### FALSE TRAIL OR CHECK BACK

Written as such or circle with cross thus:



#### RECOMMENCEMENT OF TRAIL

Within approx 100 M. of a check. The trail is only the correct one when you see 5 arrows or blobs of flour.

False trails may be marked with up to 4 arrows or blobs of flour.

#### CALLING

The Hash is NOT a race. When you are on trail call "ON ON" very frequently. When you are not on trail call "CHECKING".

IF YOU STAY FOR DRINKS THERE WILL BE A SMALL CHARGE.

IF YOU STAY FOR CURRY + RICE THE COST WILL BE AN EXTRA ¥2.00

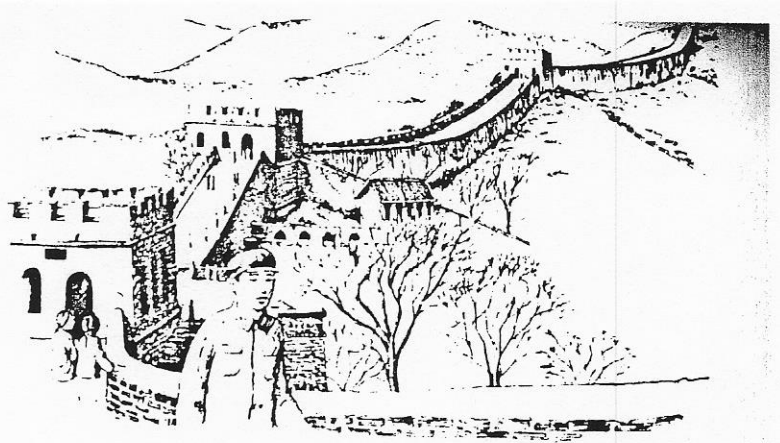

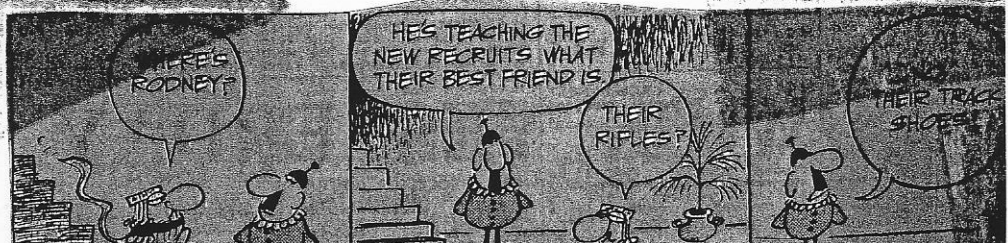

We then did some village running bringing great delight to some villagers and upsetting others as we pushed thru their dining rooms with shouts of "Are you on?"

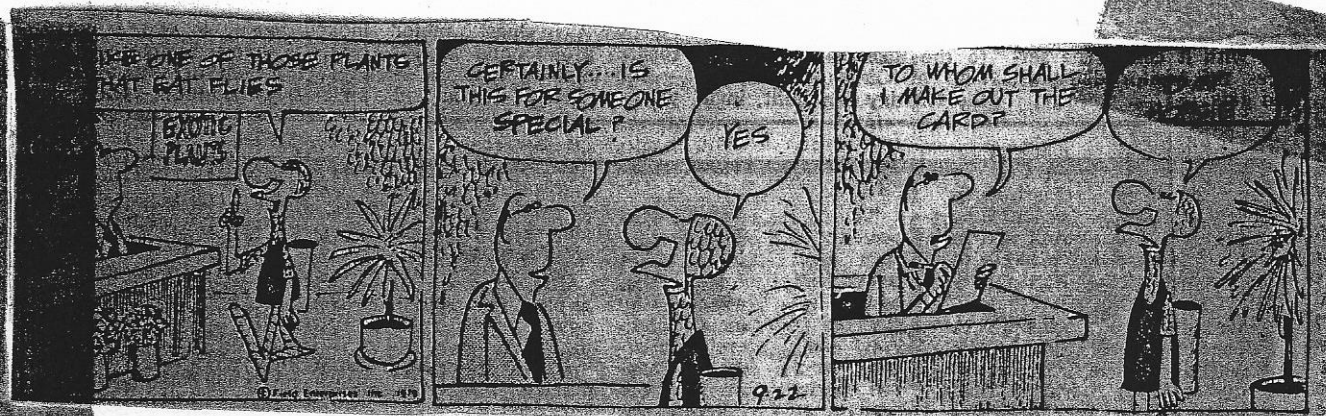
The run unfortunately didn't fool many people as it kept heading the right way but at least Jack Frost and the (Candle) Wick made the effort.

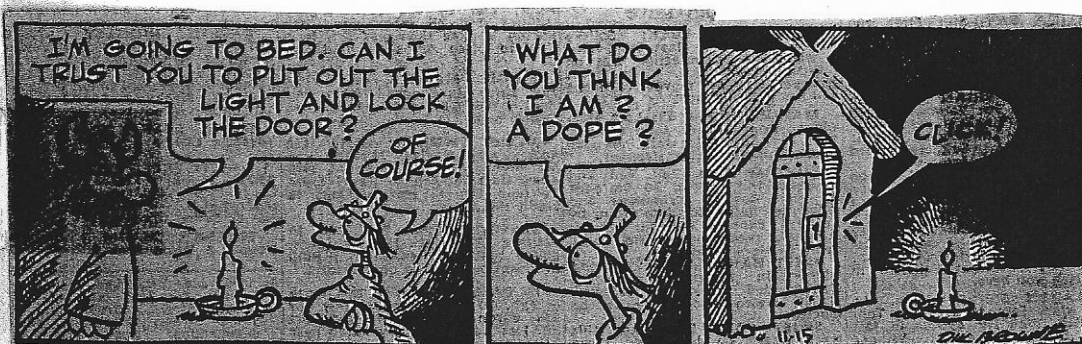

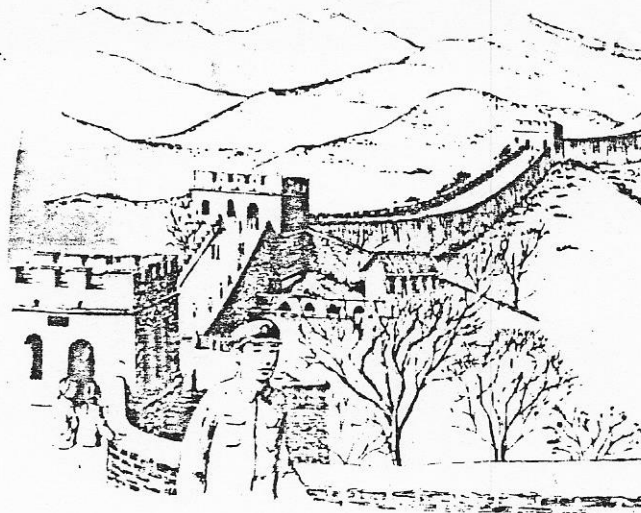

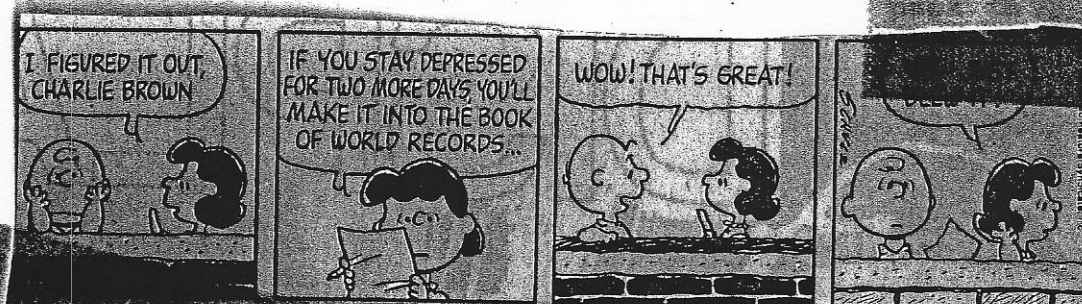
